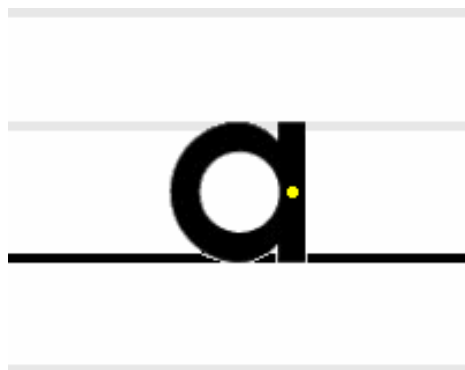


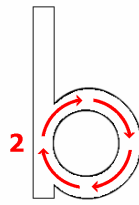
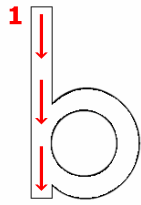

you can hang your hat.



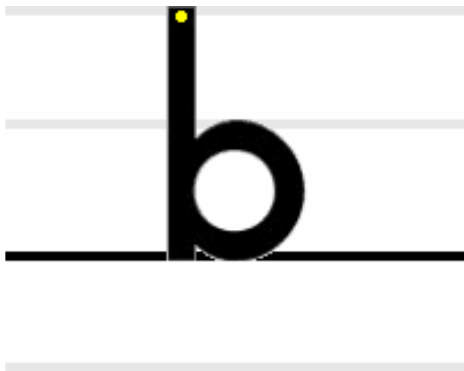


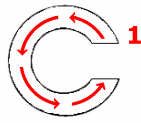

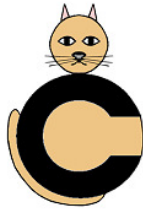

as you bash your ball.

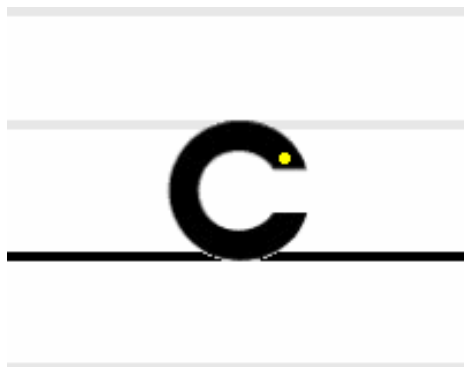


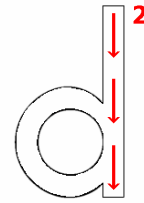
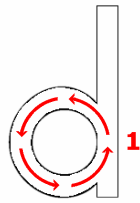

which dare to come near.



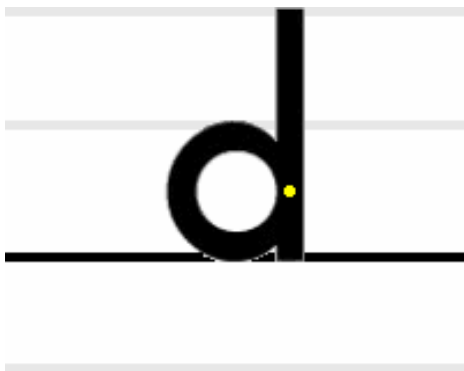


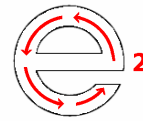
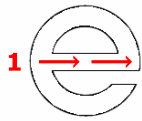
