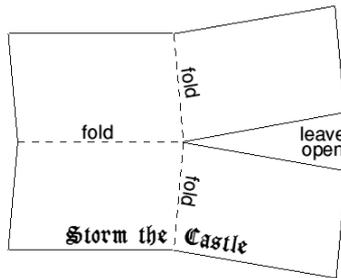


Assembly Instructions for Storm the Castle

You will need to supply a die with either dots or numbers, clear plastic adhesive film, a little modelling clay or reusable adhesive, a box in which to store the game and book of instructions, a toothpick and some strong cardboard on which to mount the game board.

Game board:

Trim two edges of each section of the game board where indicated. Glue the four sections of the game board onto A4 sheets of strong cardboard. Make sure that the edges of the game board that fit together (i.e. the edges you trimmed) are against the edge of the cardboard.



Cover each section of the game board with clear plastic film. Put the pieces of the game board together in the folded-up position. Secure them with a little tape and check that all of the sections of the game board are in the correct position and that the board folds up the right way. Then secure the sections together with strong tape.

Playing cards:

Cut out the password cards and the barter tokens. Laminate for use in schools if desired.

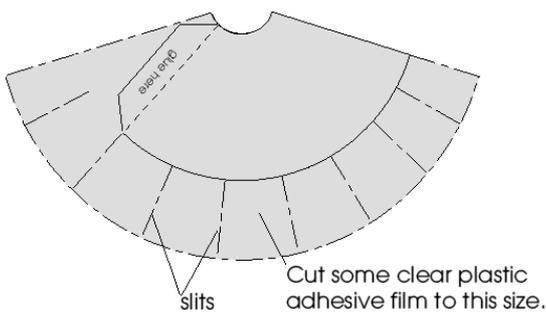
Organising boards and list of "Words on Cards":

Laminate or cover these with adhesive film if desired. Do not cut the organising boards.

Playing pieces:

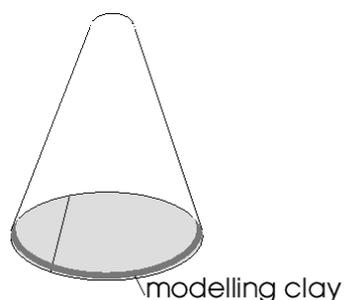
- Cut out one playing piece of each colour.

For each playing piece:



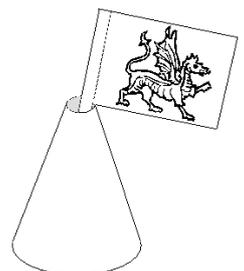
- Cut out a piece of clear plastic adhesive film larger than the playing piece
- Gently bend the playing piece into a curve so that it forms a cone with a hole in the top.
- Put some strong glue on the marked part and glue it together to make the cone.

- Make a thin roll of modelling clay or reusable adhesive about the size of a matchstick. Press this onto the inside of the base of the playing piece.



- Fold the flag in half and glue it to a toothpick.

- Test to see that the playing piece is stable when the flag is placed in it, if not, adjust the amount of modelling clay or reusable adhesive.



- Cover the playing piece with the clear plastic film, cut slits in the bottom part of the film and fold it inside, covering the modelling clay or reusable adhesive.
