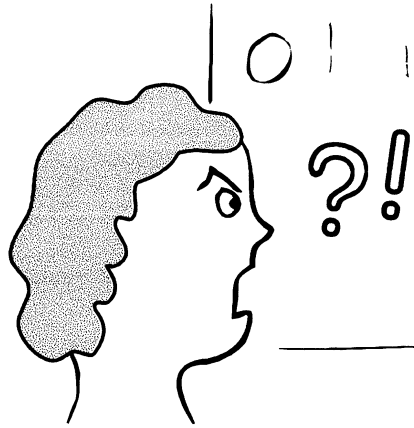
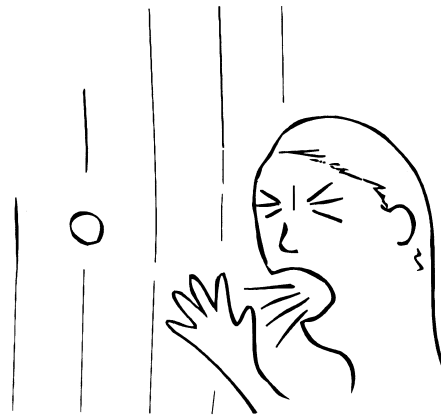

Why these jokes?

These jokes are excellent to encourage children who are having difficulties or need extra practice with reading for several reasons.

- They contain short, self-contained units.
- They use and repeat common words.
- The vocabulary has been simplified.
- The print is large and clear.
- They contain humour to maintain interest.
- They can be practised often, whenever a cooperative volunteer/victim can be found.
- Practice encourages the development of fluency in reading
- they expand vocabulary and ways of thinking with their double meanings of words.
- Each time a new, long word is introduced it is split into syllables to encourage children to develop and use this skill.

How to use this book:

More Jokes with Reading practises the common sounds of letters, common words and splitting long words into syllables.

Work through several pages of *More Jokes with Reading* at a time with your child, making sure that he or she can read and understand the jokes, particularly the double meanings of words.

If necessary, write out common words on cards, particularly words that are tricky such as where, were, how, who, what ... You can make up sets with four copies of each of these and play snap or other matching-type games with them.

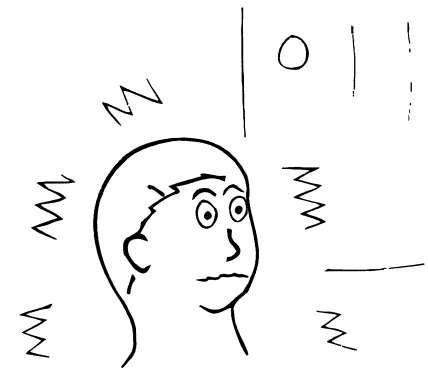
Aunts, uncles, grandparents, friends, etc. can then help by listening to your child read the jokes to them. Children enjoy this, especially if these people can not work out the answers to the riddles.

Each new volunteer gives another opportunity to practise the same material without getting bored. This practice helps the development of competence and fluency in reading.
