"Easy plus" are sets of Phonic Comic books between the "easy" books and the standard books with extra words.

Set 1 are useful for children who need extra practice with the most common sound of each letter and already know many/most of the tricky words below. Or children who have to learn the common tricky "sight words" at school. Or for all children to practise the common words once they have learned the necessary sounds.

It is important <u>not to teach most of these "sight words" just by heart</u> as many children will struggle when there are too many words to remember.

<u>Before</u> they start set 1 of the "easy plus" books, children will need to be thoroughly familiar with <u>the most common sound of each letter</u> plus

- "5" can say /z/. is, has, was, comes, robs, yells ... (Level 5)
- "I" When this letter is all by itself, it gets lonely and says, "Hello. My name is 'I'." (Level 5)
- "-ed" can say /d/ or /t/ (or /ed/) (Level 5 Review, more detail in Level 8)

The other common words used are:

a, come, for, go, have, he, here, of, no, now, said, she, some, the, they, this, to, was, were, what, with, you

Teach your child to recognise and remember the words "a and the". They should already know "the" from the titles of the easy books. "A a" sounds a bit like /u/ when it is a word.

For all new "tricky" words, point out significant features as you come across them. This may mean learning a few things ahead of the normal sequence. But it reduces the likelihood of having to remember too many words by sight, which in turn discourages guessing. The information below is intended to be background for parents.

- go, no, he, she, the A vowel on the end of a short word often says its name. (Level 6)
- for "or" corn (Find the memory aid.)
- the, they, this, with "th" there (Find the memory aid.)
- she "sh" Sh, don't wake the baby. (Find the memory aid.)

- now "ow" "ow, ow!" (Find the memory aid.)
- come, some Sometimes "o" sounds like /u/. "Ignore the silent 'e'." Cover the silent "e" with your finger.
- to Sometimes "o" sounds like loo/ to. (Level 9 other sounds of a e i o u)
- was, what Beware of "w"! "ant" becomes "want". (It works the same for "wh".)
 (Level 8 wa
- have, were Say, "Ignore the silent 'e' on have," as you cover the silent "e" with your finger. Also for were. (English words cannot end in "v".)
- here e_e = silent "e" makes the first "e" say its name. ("Ere" can sound like "ear". Australians don't say the "r" clearly.)
- of "f" sounds like /v/ in "of", but like /f/ in "off".
- Don's rod The apostrophe (') shows that the rod belongs to Don.
 Jen's net = the net that belongs to Jen
 (See Level 9.)
- missed, sobbed, fixed ... Adding "ed" means something happened in the past.
 It can be pronounced /d/ or /t/ (or /ed/) sobbed (/d/), revved (/d/), missed (/t/), fixed (/t/) ...
 (See Review in Level 5, or Level 8.)
- you, are "You" uses 2nd sound of "ou", silent "e" in are. (See Review in Level 5, or with videos near end of L7)
- said Say/says/said compare with pay/pays/paid. (Just teach this one as a sight word before Level 9.)

Teach capital letters as needed. Print the chart below for reference.

Memory aid cards for or, ow, th, sh, ar and ou can be found at Extras - Instruction Book and resources for parents and teachers to print / Letter & Memory Cards / ChFcards and VVcards

These books are extra to the sequence of learning sounds. Children don't have to read any of them before going on from Level 5. Come back to them at any time if you need to, e.g. if children are learning the words at school.

You can use the table below to find the appropriate "easy plus" book in set 1 to practise any of the common words if your child needs them. See Review in Level 5 for the pronunciation of "-ed" and "comes*".

Children will be directed to read the books when they learn the words and/or necessary sounds in the normal sequence in *Gilead® Success with Phonics*. The words will no longer be "tricky", but still need a lot of practise to become automatic.

For, now, she, this and with are completely regular using sounds that have been learned by the end of Level 7. The other words are all treated in more detail as part of "Tricky Words" in Level 9:

Tricky Words 1 - I, they, you, a, was, have, are, of Tricky Words 2 - so, go, no, he, we, be, the Tricky Words 3 - to, do, who, one, two, said, what Tricky Words 4 - here, there, where, come, some Tricky Words 5 - your, were, many, their, could

At this stage (Tricky Words in L9):

Some of the "tricky words" have been taught earlier in the program. Children may also have learned some of these words in other places.

Thus, some children will find reading most of the "tricky words" easy, and can skip through the reading exercises quickly. Others will not, and will need to take their time and work hard.

All children should do the spelling exercises. (Click on "Spell Tricky Words 1" etc.) Remember that it is good to write words as well as type them. The more senses that are used in learning a new and/or difficult task, the better.

There is often more information here than when words were introduced in Level 5 because, by this time, all the necessary background has been taught. This may be particularly helpful with learning to spell the words; also for parents and teachers to have at their fingertips, but only use as much as is suitable for your child's age and temperament.

Print two copies of the "easy plus" cards. Build up a collection of ones that your child knows/is working on. Play matching games with them ... Remember to have your child sound these words out as long as necessary - minimise guessing. But some children need to be told just to say the word once they know it. (Find them with Phonic Comics books to print.)

The "easy plus" books for Phonic Comics 2 are listed below with the new sound to practise and any common words.

- Notes: 2. ("Mum said, 'No.'" inside back cover. Similarly 28, 31, 35, 36) 5. "W" before "r" is silent, or "wr" says /r/.
 - 11. Remember, we use "tch" for /ch/ after a single vowel in a short word. Exceptions: rich, which, such, much.
