Alphabet Album (Via Review 1 to 4, now also in Levels 1-4):

b – a boy who can balance, a balancing baby; c – camel, cave, cartwheels; d – doll; e – entertainer (1st picture); f – funny faces, fascinating fire; g – glacier; h – horn, hand-to-hand; i – interesting insects again; j – Jiemba can jump; l – long legs; m – mountains; p – plane ... and pilot?; s – swing; t – train, toes; u – unwrap

Alternative Write a Word (Via Review 1 to 4, now also in Levels 2, 3, 8):

bat, hop, in, kin, log, ball

Victory Vowels (Via Review 5 to 9, now also in Levels 5, 7, 8):

i_e – bike, u_e – dune, ee – tree (2nd picture), or – torches, au – pause, oy – boys, destroy, ou – bounce, ow – blow

Ch and Friends (Via Review 5 to 9, now also in Levels 2, 4, 6, 8):

sh – crash, ng – swing, tongue; ss – cross-eyed, ll – gulls

Bothersome Blends (Via Review 5 to 9, now many in Levels 6, 8):

crash, grass, trick, try, spring, paint, lunch, stretch

Traffic Lights (Via Review 1 to 4 no letters, Review 5 to 9 with letters):

How Many Sounds? – catch, sand, trick

Which Word 2? – wood

Now What? (Substitute a sound) – pull (photos 1 and 2)

Level 7 – bowl, throw; you/are – Can you (1) run? (2) hop? (3) kick?

Are you (1) wet?

Level 8 – baseball, bang, fence, bath

Tricky Words 1 – They have lots of fun.

Tricky Words 4 – Here they come. Here come some people.

Tricky Words 5 – Their feet are wet. “Eat your food.”
